Gravel Roads Resources & Construction

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To Start a Project

- Identify the inventoried roads with bus route (Planning)
- Identify partners
- Identify funding sources
- Coordinate with Chapter Officials and school district to identify road segments for graveling
- Obtain A & E clearances
- Identify gravel source (pit) close to project
- Identify construction water source (well or pond) close to project
- Identify haul roads
- Graveling is road maintenance per BIA (2"thick)
- Local gravel sources to save hauling costs

Gravel Source and Construction Water Source

- Gravel source must be relative close to the project
 - Gravel may be inexpensive
 - Hauling cost increases as the miles increase between the pit and project
- Construction Water must be relatively close to the project
 - Permits required
 - Close to site to reduce travel time

Individual Road Projects

- BIA or NDOT (partnership) has been a willing partner to provide road crew to apply aggregate material
- Navajo County has provided funds to purchase material from gravel pits near or on the reservation
- Navajo County has provided drainage culverts for specific NDOT projects
