 - Emergency Medical Services




SHSP Emphasis Areas

- Restraint Usage
- Young drivers
- Speeding
- Impaired driving
- Roadway/Roadside
- The above five areas are associated with the highest numbers of fatality and injury collisions
- Data collection

Statistics • Using the 2007 SHSP until 2012 • Decrease in fatality collisions statewide • 1,193 in 2005 down to 825 in 2012 • Decrease injury collisions statewide • Serious injuries also decreased from 7,026 in 2005 to 4,462 in 2012 The overall goal was a 12% reduction in fatal collisions. The actual reduction was 23%1
